ORDER

- A. Entry Requirements Effective August 2, 2021
 - Access to the courthouse remains restricted as previously ordered but as modified herein, to be effective as follows:

No individual shall enter the courthouse if they have tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 10 days, or if they have been ordered by Public Health to isolate, or if they have had sustained contact for 15 minutes or more with someone described above, or if the individual has a fever of 100.4 or higher, or if the individual has COVID-19 symptoms.

Any individual entering the courthouse must be in compliance with these conditions to gain entry into the courthouse. Any individual not in compliance shall call the Tehama Superior Court at (530) 527-3563.

B. Mandatory Masks

Masks or facial coverings are required while inside Tehama County Superior Court facilities, regardless of vaccination status. This will remain in place at this time for all individuals entering the Tehama Superior Court including court users, court staff, judicial officers, inmates, jurors/prospective jurors, and counsel. The mask requirement is to ensure workplace and courthouse safety in a manner that maintains efficient and consistent court operations and complies with the current Cal OSHA regulations.

All prior Orders not specifically mentioned herein remain in full force and effect.
